Dog tweets range from "Chasing everything that moves is a full-time job!" if the dog is very active to "Your comforter does what its name says it does" if it's sleeping.

The device runs on wi-fi and the USB receiver needs to be plugged in a switched-on computer.

Mattel says the tag won't work on small dogs or cats, so Chihuahuas and Siamese are off the grid for now.
