

Razer Updates Blade Stealth Notebook

Razer uses E3 2017 to launch a gaming notebook refresh-- the Blade Stealth, a device packing a 13.3-inch display inside the same size chassis as the previous model (which had a 12.5-inch display).



The updated Blade Stealth has a design less garish than typical Razer products, with the glowing logo replaced with a subtle two-tone version and a rainbow backlit keys ditched for regular white lighting. The display features a 3200 x 1800 resolution IGZO panel promising 100% sRGB colour gamut coverage and 400 nits brightness, and inside the machine are a 2.7GHz Core i7-7500U CPU, integrated Intel HD Graphics 620, up to 16GB RAM and up to 1TB PCIe SSD.

The chassis is built out of CNC aluminium, while a Thunderbolt 3 port allows connection of an external GPU enclosure. As for power, the battery claims up to 9 hours of use on a single charge.

The updated Razer Blade Stealth hits the market from 14 June 2017 in either black or gunmetal gray.
