

While Google has all but confirmed the reveal of the Pixel 4 for the upcoming October 2019 hardware event, *9to5Google* reports the search giant will also present a Pixelbook, specifically a 13.3-inch Chromebook with a 4K display.



Supposedly dubbed the "Pixelbook Go," the device sees Google adopt a more traditional laptop form factor, as opposed to the 2-in-1 hybrid design of the original Pixelbook. The company had already hinted at making such a device back at the April Google Cloud Next 2019 event, with a presentation slide reading "now, our goal is to empower your agile, modern workforce to be productive on-the-go," while suggesting a future laptop.

*9to5Google* says the Pixelbook Go features a light design, with the bottom having a "tactile feel" making it easier to hold. The 13.3-inch display is in a 16:9 aspect ratio and touch-capable, and higher-end models will offer 4K resolution display bearing the same "Molecular Display" branding as the Pixel Slate.

The laptop will be available in a range of configurations depending on processor, RAM and display. The news website points out Intel Core m3, i3 and i7 options with either 8/16GB of

RAM and 64/128/256GB storage. Also included are a pair of front-firing speakers, two microphones and a 2MP front-facing camera, as well as a Titan C security chip. Connectivity comes through two USB-C ports, wifi and Bluetooth.

We should learn more about the Pixelbook Go, together with all the devices Google has in the works, on the 15 October event.
