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Scan teams up with the BBC to produce a PC case set to delight your nerdier customers-- the TARDIS case, an official aluminium replica of iconic prop from the Doctor Who TV series.



Looking like a blue police box, the TARDIS (stands for Time and Relative Dimension in Space) is actually a time machine and happens to be the preferred mode of transport for an immortal alien known only as "The Doctor."

According to the show, the TARDIS is supposed to be bigger on the inside than the outside. No such luck for the PC case, although Scan fits in a 3.1GHz Pentium G2120 processor, 8GB of DDR3 memory, a 300W PSU and a Sony Blu-ray writer cleverly hidden behind the "Police Box" sign.

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
