In Win updates the 2013 tou PC chassis with the tou 2.0-- a version featuring a sleeker angled design while retaining the same tempered glass with dual-mirror effect.



Like the original, the tou 2.0 has a cool gimmick where ith looks opaque when powered down (or all internal LEDs are off), but becomes transparent once internal lighting is on. The name actually suggests such a name, since tou refers to transparency in Mandarin Chinese.

Holding the thicker tempered glass panels (5mm, rather than 3mm) together is an aluminiuim alloy frame. The thumbscrews are hidden below the ventilation vents, and the front has a touch-sensitive panel for lighting control. A SIV-1065W illuminated power supply is included, and I/O options come through a quick-access USB 3.1 type-C on the bottom of the front panel plus x3 USB 3.0 ports, 3.5mm stereo headphone jack and microphone socket.

The chassis carries up to x2 360mm radiators or x6 120mm fans and supports up to E-ATX sized motherboards with 8 PCI expansion slots, GPUs up to 345mm in size (with HDD trays) and CPU heatsinks up to 185mm tall. Handling storage are x5 individually removable 2.5/3.5-inch multi-functional brackets.

In Win is still to announce when the tou 2.0 hits the market but it will be in limited numbers, with each chassis marked with a unique metal stamped nameplate.

Go In Win Launches tòu 2.0 Signature PC Chassis
