Google opens the Chrome Web Store to countries beyond the USA, with users from 24 countries now able to buy or sell apps through the Chrome browser.



The list of participant countries includes Argentina, Austria, Belgium, Brazil, Czech Republic, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Hong Kong, India, Israel, Italy, Japan, Mexico, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Russia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland and the United Kingdom.

The recently launched in-app payments remain US-only, for now.
